S.A.F.E. Rehoming was founded on 22nd September 2017 following a campaign to acknowledge the closure of the largest animal shelter in Northern Beaches of Sydney in July 2017. Following the dedication and hard work of the team involved in that campaign, S.A.F.E. was born as a registered charity and its history began.

The first animals were brought into care less than a week later and through an extremely committed and enthusiastic foster network, the animals have top quality care. And although they come from a variety of places with their own stories, through S.A.F.E. they are able to continue that story forwards.

OUR OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

S.A.F.E. Rehoming's objectives are in short, to rescue, rehabilitate (when necessary) and rehome pets. Some of these pets have been abandoned and left as strays, some are born 'on the streets', some are born in our care while others are from loving homes which can no longer effectively care for them. No matter where they come from, each and every one of them holds a special place in our hearts. Following are the statistics from 22nd September 2017 through to 30th June 2018.

Where did all those pets come from?

58 from Blacktown Animal Holding Facility

15 taken into care from Good Samaritan rescues (people who found them on the streets and brought them to us)

- 12 Private Surrenders
- 12 animals born in care
- 1 from West Ryde Veterinary Hospital
- 1 transferred from Westies Cat Rescue



Where are all those pets now?

S.A.F.E.'s first adoption was on 11th November 2017. Since then the response has been nothing short of incredible, especially considering all adoptions have been carried out from foster homes, with minimal advertising exposure of S.A.F.E. given the size of the organisation.

Unfortunately, not everything always goes to plan. Young kittens and older cats are susceptible to disease and illness and when dealing with such large numbers of pets, it is inevitable that we will lose some. Young kittens, especially those who are no longer with their mothers are particularly at risk of developing fatal problems early in life. In total we lost 8 pets during this period, 7 of those passed away peacefully in their foster homes and the remaining one required calm euthanasia after complications post desex surgery. It's always with a heavy heart that these pets are lost to us, but they will forever remain in the hearts' of their foster carers.

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

As you will no doubt be aware, the S.A.F.E. Rehoming committee has been working tirelessly to find a suitable location for S.A.F.E. to establish a cattery on the Northern Beaches of Sydney. While this task has been long and at times frustrating for all involved, the team remain confident that they can see this through and provide a much needed facility for the area. Given the support from the community and the volume of enquires fielded by the team every week, it is obvious to them that this facility will be welcomed and well utilised once it is set up. The members will be the first to know of any developments on this front. In the meantime, the team is carrying on the cause and trying to help as many pets as possible.
